Master of Divinity (MDiv)

• Introduction (English Program)

The Master of Divinity (MDiv) is a three-year program tailored for individuals preparing for pastoral ministry or other forms of Christian ministry. A key feature of the MDiv program is its broad curriculum, covering biblical, theological, and practical disciplines, with and emphasis of exegeting Scripture in its original languages (Hebrew and Greek). This program is also well-suited for those intending to pursue advanced degrees such as ThM or PhD.

- Please note that although the ACSI certificate program is a voluntary and optional program -in addition to and separate from MDiv- all MDiv students can pursue the ACSI certificate if their schedule is flexible, since we have our own MACE and MEd programs in which all ACSI courses are offered.

Here are some procedural considerations:

- (1) To be enrolled in this program, you need to register through Torch Trinity Center for Education and Ministry (TTCEM: 02-570-7565, ttcem@ttgu.ac.kr), which coordinates the ACSI program.
- (2) Students need to take 5 ACSI courses (15 credits) in addition to Educational Ministry (3 credits) and Christian Counseling Ministry (3 credits).
- (3) Students need to take ED6513 Practical Field Education I [0] and ED6524 Practical Field Education II [1].
- (4) Students need to complete Philosophy of Christian school education requirements (DVD session, 5 book reviews/reflection papers, and a written essay on Christian philosophy of education).
- (5) Since all or most ACSI courses are offered primarily for the MACE and MEd students, the MDiv students might face some difficulty in terms of class schedule conflicts. In such a case, you should take the MDiv courses first and wait for the same ACSI class to be offered next time (ACSI courses are usually offered in an annual cycle).
- (6) If you find it impossible to fulfill all the ACSI requirements before your graduation, you may return and complete the ACSI program after graduation.
